My congratulations to Brothers Bob Farrell and Dan Hopping . Great Newsletter.

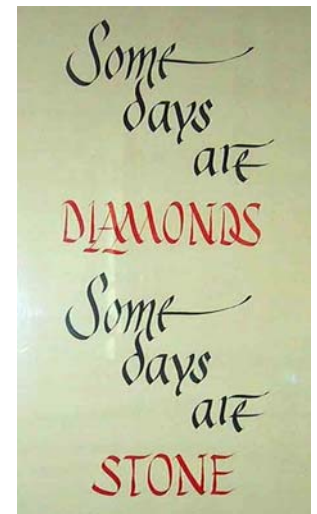
